

A review: There has been talk of ‘some’ ironers that promote that they do not require waxing. Well, here’s the facts -

What “waxing” does:

(Or, what “not waxing” doesn’t do:)

- 1) Protects all heated cylinders (creates a “barrier” between the cylinder & foreign objects - such as polyester & residual chemicals)
- 2) Eliminates static build-up
- 3) Prolongs the life of return ribbons **and** compression roll covers
- 4) Is necessary on high production ironers (such as CMV models)
- 5) Promotes better quality on an ironed product
- 6) Chrome plating does not guarantee that linen will not get stuck in an ironer. Chrome plating expands and contracts . . . and will “buckle” over time (Did you know that the old SHARPER FINISH, INC. experimented and produced chrome plated cylinder ironers?) = created future problems.
